



\$47 million: Continue fixing mental health care

We must make improvements to get our loved ones the care they need.

We need to:

- Provide quality care with additional hospital staff.
- Create safer environments for both patients and staff.

Behavioral Health Innovation Fund: \$13.7 million

Allows more flexibility to allocate needed resources toward hospital and community mental health services.

Transitional Support for Western State Hospital: \$11 million

Additional funding for basic services.

State Hospital Registered Nurse Staff: \$3.6 million

More registered nurses at state hospital wards.

Compensation Increases to Recruit & Retain Hospital Staff: \$9.6 million

Increases salaries for doctors, nurses, and other clinical staff.

Crisis Triage Beds at Eastern and Western State Hospitals: \$2.6 million

Assessment of and treatment for individuals experiencing a mental health crisis without the use of long-term hospitalization.

Mobile Crisis Teams: \$2.7 million

Add more mobile mental health services to stabilize individuals in crisis to prevent further deterioration and provide immediate treatment and intervention.

Housing Support and Step-Down Services: \$2 million

Supportive housing services and short-term rent assistance for individuals in existing, or at risk of entering, inpatient behavioral health treatment.

UW Psychiatry Collaboration: \$600,000

This is a partnership between UW and Western State Hospital to develop a plan to create a high quality forensic teaching unit.
