## HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE 2024 WASHINGTON STATE LEGISLATURE

#### A HOME FOR EVERYONE



- \$127 million increase to the state's Housing Trust Fund to help build affordable housing like the Gonzaga Family Haven above
- Created incentives to convert underutilized commercial buildings into housing
- Expanded a property tax exemption for seniors and people with disabilities who have ADUs on their property
- Created additional protections for people living in mobile home communities

#### **PRIORITIZING PUBLIC SAFETY**

- Increased funding for training law enforcement officers
- Strengthened hate crime laws to include defacement of public property
- Made improvements to how the state responds to victims of child trafficking and sexual assault
- Adopted firearm safety legislation to limit open carry in sensitive places, require gun owners to report lost or stolen firearms within 24 hours, and ensure firearm dealers store inventory securely
- Major investments to enhance traffic safety and prevent DUIs

#### **BUILDING HEALTHIER COMMUNITIES**

- Expanded the UW RIDE Program, which will train more urgently needed dental providers in Spokane
- Expanded access to physician assistants in rural and underserved communities
- Protected abortion providers by allowing the use of a clinic's name on medication labels in place of the prescriber's name
- Adopted new protections so people who have medical emergencies do not get slapped with a surprise ambulance bill
- Invested in behavioral health services, including funding to build innovative tribal behavioral health facilities in partnership with tribes and the federal government

#### SUCCESS FOR EVERY CHILD



- Increased support for K-12 students, with a particular focus on special education
- Expanded the number of students eligible for free school meals
- Improved the Working Families Tax Credit, a highly successful program that last year provided support for 163,000 Washington households
- Removed barriers to employment for child care workers
- Increased funding for the Early Support for Infants and Toddlers program
- Required all middle and high schools to educate students on the dangers of opioids

#### A HEALTHY PLANET



- Continued funding for important Climate Commitment Act programs that lead to cleaner air, new clean energy jobs, and more resilient communities:
  - Free transit for all youth under 18
  - Electric school buses
  - Safer walking and cycling routes
  - Heat pumps for thousands of low-income families
  - Public electric vehicle charging stations
  - Utility bill assistance to bring cost relief to 750,000 households
  - Engineering study to reduce and reuse carbon emissions from Spokane's Waste to Energy Plant
- Added 6PPD, a chemical commonly found in vehicle tires, to the priority chemical list under the Safer Products for Washington Act to protect ecosystems and waterways like the Spokane river

# SPOTLIGHT: NORTHEAST YOUTH & FAMILY SERVICES



In 2024, the state capital budget designated funding for Northeast

Youth and Family Services (NEYFS) to expand operations in their new facility. NEYFS is a family resource center working to eliminate barriers to children's' success in Spokane. This funding will help support new multicultural community engagement opportunities like a food pantry, educational garden, and community kitchen.
