

WHAT COULD HAPPEN: Behavioral health investments take a significant reduction, including reduction to training and treatment for substance use disorder.

If enacted, the four year Book 1 budget moves Washington backward and reduces efforts to treat substance use disorder and train the next generation of behavioral health and SUD practitioners through cuts to:

- Does not fund non-native substance use disorder treatment at Tribal facilities (-\$170 million)
- Does not fund opioid use disorder treatment expansion in corrections facilities (-\$14 million)
- Personal care services which help individuals with significant diagnoses stay in adult family homes or assisted living facilities. (-\$111 million)
- · The University of Washington Behavioral Health Teaching Facility (-\$40 million)
