WHAT COULD HAPPEN: Significant cuts to efforts to provide treatment to those who enter the criminal justice system, as well as reentry investments, and health care staffing in the Department of Corrections.

In the Book 1 budget, important programs in corrections face cuts or are eliminated entirely over the next four years:

- Eliminates body scanner funding necessary for limiting introduction of drugs and contraband into DOC facilities (-\$10.7 million)
- Does not include increases for healthcare or overtime staff support (-\$88 million)
- Does not include opioid treatment expansion (-\$14 million)
- Eliminates funding to reduce solitary confinement (-\$18 million)
- Eliminates reentry housing vouchers (-\$7.6 million)
- Reduces funding for reentry support (-\$69 million)
- Reduces incarcerated individual CI wages (-\$7 million)
- Reduces patient and behavioral health contracted care (-\$27 million)
