FAMILIES

- Increasing the number of school nurses & counselors for K-12 students (**HB 1664**)
- Providing monthly diaper subsidies for low-income families (SB 5838)
 - Expanding access to outdoor education for young students (**HB 2078**)
 - \$13M to expand the Early Childhood Education & Assistance Program

SENIORS

- Protecting consumers from out-of-network healthcare charges (HB 1688)
 - Capping insulin co-pays at \$35 a month (SB 5546)
 - \$263M to support & retain long-term care providers
 - \$58M to increase allowances for in-home personal needs
 - \$24M to help manage caseload for local Area Agencies on Aging

VETERANS

- Preventing suicide for veterans and our active military (HB 1181)
 - Washington National Guard education grants (HB 1642)
 - Affordable higher education for military families (**SB 5874**)
